A National Problem

Wales faces a nature crisis

Wales is home to a rich and varied landscape, from Celtic rainforests and wetlands to rugged mountains and open moorland - places that should support a wealth of wildlife.

Yet today, much of this precious natural heritage is under threat.

According to the **State of Nature Report 2023**¹, 18% of species in Wales are now at risk of extinction.

In Radnorshire, as across much of the UK, we are seeing a steady decline in many species and the ongoing loss and fragmentation of our most vulnerable habitats. As an example, Radnorshire was once a stronghold for the marsh fritillary butterfly, but it is likely that we have lost this species entirely due to habitat degradation².

To halt and reverse this biodiversity loss, we need bold action now.

We are creating space for nature to thrive, and your support plays a vital role in making this possible.

Gilfach, once a working hill farm, is now a flagship nature reserve nestled in the Marteg Valley: Rich in wildlife, from leaping salmon to pied flycatchers, dippers, and over a quarter of all lichen species in Wales, Gilfach offers visitors an inspiring glimpse of what nature can be when given space to thrive.

Pentwyn Farm is being transformed through rewilding and natural processes into a model farm for the future: It is producing high-welfare, low-input meat, alongside fruit and vegetables from a market garden. It is a place where we want nature to flourish and communities to connect with the land, while creating a wilder, more sustainable future in which to produce food.

Rivers are vital corridors of life, connecting meadows, wetlands and woodlands while supporting a rich diversity of wildlife. When healthy, they help tackle both the climate and nature crises.

At Radnorshire Wildlife Trust, we know that protecting wildlife within our reserves alone is not enough. We are part of a broader network of dedicated individuals, communities, and organisations working to protect and restore the iconic River Wye (Afon Gwy) and its beautiful tributaries.

We envision a wilder future for our rivers, using a catchment-based approach to improve the health of the entire river system, from the Lugg to the Marteg and Ithon. This future sees climate-resilient riparian corridors, where upland ecosystems and farmland thrive alongside healthy, living rivers.
