Role title: Trustee


Salary: Voluntary role

Main duties and responsibilities:

As a member of the board of trustees, you will:

- Provide leadership and strategic direction for the Trust, including agreeing appropriate policies and scrutinising performance against agreed goals
- Champion Radnorshire Wildlife Trust and its values, creating an innovation culture where risks are appropriately managed
- Represent the Trust locally with opportunities at a Wales / UK level, if interested
- Ensure the Trust complies with its governing document, charity law, company law, and any other relevant legislation or regulations
- Ensure the Trust uses its resources effectively and efficiently to deliver its vision and mission
- Utilise your knowledge and skills for the best interests of the Trust
- Ensure UK Wildlife Trust Strategies, policies, and views are taken into account
- Appoint the Chief Executive and monitor their performance





Who are we looking for?

Trustees need the ability to think strategically and to contribute positively in a collaborative way. We are particularly interested in people with a background in finance and accounting. We are seeking a trustee who will Chair the Finance Committee, as well as trustees willing to take on the roles of Chair and Secretary in the future. Fundraising experience would also be valuable to the Trust.

Finance: Responsibility for taking the strategic lead on financial issues working with the Finance Manager to provide the board with clear and accurate financial information. To advise trustees on the financial implications of RWT's activities, and provide oversight and advice in relation to the annual budgets and strategic plans, ensuring that financial risks are accurately reflected.

Fundraising: Responsible for supporting the CEO and broader team to grow and diversify RWT's income streams to ensure a sustainable future while delivering more impact for nature.

We would, however, be delighted to hear from anyone with other backgrounds and experiences that would add to the diversity of skills and expertise on the board.

Equality, diversity and inclusion


